

NEW YORK STATE VOTER'S BILL OF RIGHTS



AS A REGISTERED NEW YORK VOTER, YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- (1) vote in privacy at a polling place, regardless of physical disability;
- (2) bring materials, including this card, into the voting booth with you;
- (3) take time in voting;
- (4) request and receive assistance in voting if you need it, from a bi-partisan team of poll workers who must provide aid without influencing your vote, or from anyone you choose, other than your employer or your union representative.
- (5) vote by paper emergency ballot if the voting machine is broken;
- (6) vote by paper affidavit ballot if poll workers cannot find your registration or challenge it;
- (7) receive and use another paper ballot, if your ballot is defective, mutilated or spoiled;
- (8) vote after the poll-closing time if you were waiting on line to vote before closing time.
