The meeting was called to order at 7:01 P.M. by Chairman Jonke who requested Legislator Ellner lead in the Pledge of Allegiance and Legislator Sayegh lead in the Legislative Prayer.

Chairman Jonke asked everyone to remain standing in a moment of silence for Special Police Officer Timothy Stewart, who passed away last week. He asked that he and his family be kept in everyone's thoughts and prayers.

Chairman Jonke called on the Clerk for a roll call. Upon roll call, Legislators Montgomery, Gouldman, Addonizio, Ellner, Castellano, Sayegh, Crowley and Chairman Jonke were present. Legislator Nacerino was absent. Also present was Legislative Counsel Firriolo.

PROCLAMATION

Chairman Jonke recognized Legislator Sayegh who presented the recipients, Margie Silverman and Lloyd Hartley, with the proclamation "Honoring Office for Senior Resources Employees."

HONORING OFFICE FOR SENIOR RESOURCES EMPLOYEES MARGIE SILVERMAN & LLOYD HARTLEY

WHEREAS, Margie Silverman, Site Manager of the William Koehler Memorial Senior Center in Mahopac, immediately jumped into action on December 16, 2022 when she saw a senior choking on food. She began the Heimlich Maneuver on the gentleman, but quickly realized due to his relative size she would not be able to muster the force needed to dislodge the food item and called for help; and

WHEREAS, Office for Senior Resources Driver Lloyd Hartley was in the kitchen preparing meals to be delivered to homebound seniors when he heard Site Manager Silverman's call for assistance. He ran into the dining room where he performed the Heimlich Maneuver on the gentlemen, successfully dislodging the food he was choking on. The gentleman's breathing quickly returned to normal; he was examined by responding EMTs and taken to the emergency room. The gentleman has since returned to the William Koehler Memorial Senior Center many times with his wife; and

WHEREAS, The swift action of both Site Manager Margie Silverman and Driver Lloyd Hartley was a result of their sincere compassion for others coupled with the CPR and Heimlich Maneuver Training that is provided to Office for Senior Resources Staff twice per year by the Putnam County Bureau of Emergency Services, the most recent training happening just the week before; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Putnam County Executive and the Putnam County Legislature do hereby recognize Margie Silverman, Site Manager of the William Koehler Memorial Senior Center and Lloyd Hartley, Office for Senior Resources Driver for their immediate response, which resulted in a lifesaving act. We are proud to serve alongside such brave and compassionate employees!

Item #6 – Pre-filed resolutions:

RULES, ENACTMENTS & INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE (Chairwoman Addonizio, Legislators Ellner & Gouldman)

Item #6a - Approval/ Local Law Amending Chapter 220 of the Code of Putnam County Entitled "Taxation" (Volunteer Firefighters & Ambulance Corps Exemption) was next. Chairman Jonke recognized Legislator Addonizio, Chairwoman of the Rules, Enactments & Intergovernmental Relations Committee. On behalf of the members of the Committee, Legislators Ellner and Gouldman, Legislator Addonizio moved the following:

Legislator Addonizio stated that our volunteers are the backbone of Putnam County. She stated that this will not only encourage new members but also help to retain them. She stated that she was proud to move this forward.

Chairman Jonke stated that he has been in the tax business over 30 years and this is an exemption that truly rewards our neighbors. He stated that we fund our neighbors' exemptions, and because these are volunteers who serve our community, we are rewarding those members of the community who sacrifice their time to keep us safe. He stated that he was in full support of this exemption.

Legislator Gouldman believed this was a good move for Putnam County and he was glad that the Governor approved this to occur throughout New York State. He explained that it takes a very special individual to volunteer in the fire department or ambulance corps. He stated that every department throughout Putnam County is in need of more of these dedicated volunteers. He stated that he is in support of this exemption.

Legislator Montgomery stated that she sat with the Association of Towns before becoming a Legislator. She explained that there were many discussions on how to solve the dilemma of retaining and recruiting volunteers. She stated that New York volunteers have declined by 32% over the last 25 years. She stated that this exemption will help with the retention. She stated being a volunteer EMT was the most rewarding investment in her life. She stated that her son works as a professional EMT and is also a volunteer

EMT on his time off. She encouraged every taxing agency to approve the same exemption.

Chairman Jonke stated that the Governor signed this legislation on December 15, 2022 and we worked hard to move this quickly to pass this legislation in order for the volunteers to apply by the taxable status date this year which is March 1, 2023. He stated that it moved quickly because of the support of this Legislature.

RESOLUTION #27

APPROVAL/ LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 220 OF THE CODE OF PUTNAM COUNTY ENTITLED "TAXATION" (Members of Volunteer Fire Depts & Ambulance Corps Exemption)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the County of Putnam as follows:

Section 1.

Article X of Chapter 220 of the Putnam County Code as added by L.L. No. 1 of 2003 is hereby repealed and replaced as follows:

ARTICLE X

Exemption for Qualified Members of Volunteer Fire Departments and Ambulance Corps

§ 220-65 Legislative intent.

Chapter 670 of the Laws of 2022 added a new section 466-a to the Real Property Tax Law, repealing prior sections 466-a through 466-k, though continuing the exemption provided therein. New section 466-a provides a real property tax exemption of 10% for qualified members of volunteer fire departments and ambulance corps statewide, subject to adoption by individual municipalities. Members of volunteer fire departments and ambulance corps provide valuable services to the people of Putnam County. In order to be certified and recertified, such volunteers must undertake numerous hours of training on their own time and frequently at their own expense. The purpose of this exemption is to maintain the ranks of the volunteer corps and encourage volunteers to join. The enabling legislation enacted by the State Legislature requires that localities must adopt a local law in order to afford those volunteers such exemption.

§ 220-66 Requirements.

Such exemption shall not be granted to an enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service residing in such county unless:

- A. The applicant resides in the city, town, or village which is served by such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service;
- B. The property is the primary residence of the applicant;

- C. The property is used exclusively for residential purposes; provided however, that in the event any portion of such property is not used exclusively for the applicant's residence but is used for other purposes, such portion shall be subject to taxation and the remaining portion only shall be entitled to the exemption provided by this section; and
- D. The applicant has been certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or voluntary ambulance service as an enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or voluntary ambulance service for a period of five years of service.
- E. The applicant must file a certificate from his or her qualifying organization that he or she is an enrolled member. Such certification of membership must certify that the member received credit under a service award program defined by Article 11-A, 11-AA, 11-AAA, or 11-AAAA of the General Municipal Law for the period of service claimed in the application.

§ 220-67 Lifetime exemption.

Any enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service who accrues more than twenty years of active service and is so certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service, shall be granted the ten percent exemption as authorized by this section for the remainder of his or her life as long as his or her primary residence is located within such county.

§ 220-68 Spousal exemption where member is killed in the line of duty.

Un-remarried spouses of volunteer firefighters or volunteer ambulance workers killed in the line of duty. An exemption granted under this chapter shall be continued, and a pre-existing exemption shall be reinstated, where the exemption was previously claimed by an enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service, to such deceased enrolled member's un-remarried spouse if such member is killed in the line of duty; provided, however, that:

A. Such un-remarried spouse is certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service as an un-remarried spouse of an enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service who was killed in the line of duty; and

- B. Such deceased volunteer had been an enrolled member for at least five years; and
- C. Such deceased volunteer had been receiving the exemption prior to his or her death.

§ 220-69 Spousal exemption where member is deceased.

Un-remarried spouses of deceased volunteer firefighters or volunteer ambulance workers. An exemption granted under this chapter shall be continued, and a pre-existing exemption shall be reinstated, to an un-remarried spouse of a deceased enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service; provided, however, that:

- A. Such un-remarried spouse is certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service as an un-remarried spouse of a deceased enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service; and
- B. Such deceased volunteer had been an enrolled member for at least twenty years; and
- C. Such deceased volunteer and un-remarried spouse had been receiving the exemption for such property prior to the death of such volunteer.

§ 220-70 Application for exemption.

- A. Application for such exemption, along with the certificate of membership defined above, shall be filed with the applicable town assessor on or before the taxable status date on a form as prescribed by the Commissioner of the Office of Real Property Tax Services.
- B. Certification shall be required for any period of time claimed by an applicant that is not already on file with the applicable town assessor.
- C. The assessor shall review the application and certification to ensure they have satisfied the requirements of this law.

§ 220-71 Continuation of exemption.

No applicant who is a volunteer firefighter or volunteer ambulance worker who by reason of such status is receiving any benefit under the provisions of this article on the effective date of this section shall suffer any diminution of such benefit because of the provisions of this section. Any exemption under Article X of

Chapter 220 as added by L.L. No. 1 of 2003 shall be considered the same and equivalent to the exemption available under this article.

Section 3.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon the filing with the secretary of state.

Item #6d - Approval/ Budgetary Transfer (23T002)/ County Executive Office/ Reorganization-Reclassification/ Staff & Department Salaries was next. On behalf of the members of the Personnel Committee, Legislators Castellano and Nacerino, Chairman Jonke presented the following:

Legislator Addonizio requested the Chairman to divide the question for the \$40,000 licensing software line and the \$24,625 increase for the Deputy County Executive.

Chairman Jonke clarified that it was the first and last bullet on the resolution.

Legislator Addonizio said, "yes."

Chairman Jonke requested Legislative Counsel Firriolo to explain the process of dividing this proposed resolution.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo stated that under the Legislative Manual for the procedure for the dividing of a question is that if any question contains more than one (1) distinct proposition it shall be divided by the Chair at the request of any one (1) member. He explained that it is a nondiscretionary act that the Chair must do when those two (2) conditions are met. He stated that it does not need a second.

Chairman Jonke requested if there was discussion on the first bullet point for the increase in salary for the Deputy County Executive.

Legislator Addonizio believed it was difficult to justify this increase to her constituents at this time. She believed it would have a rippling effect on our Putnam County employees. She stated that it begs the question that when our employees decline health insurance that they would ask for a raise. She stated that her position not to support this request had nothing to do with the qualifications or expertise of the individual in said position.

Legislator Sayegh explained that during the 2023 budget, the Legislature approved the Deputy County Executive salary to include a 3.5% COLA increase bring the position to \$129,375. She stated that the County Executive is proposing an additional increase of \$24,625 which would bring this salary to \$154,000. She stated that this increase puts the Deputy County Executive's salary in line with department heads, making more than many who have decades of service to Putnam County. She stated that this is an unprecedented increase for one (1) candidate. She understands that the candidate is well qualified and is a talented administrator. She also understood that he had a salary greater than this amount at his previous employment. However, this is a budgeted salary line that was open to the public and was understood at the time of his excepting employment here in Putnam County. She stated that it was not the responsibility of the Putnam County taxpayer to make any candidate whole for any position previously held at another job. She explained that it could be revisited during the budget process. She stated that at this time she cannot hand over \$24,000 of taxpayer monies to justify the expense of one (1) employee. She stated that she has repeatedly heard that the justification for the increase is that this candidate would not be accepting health insurance benefits. However, this should not be used to increase or offset proposed salaries. She explained that Putnam County employees receive \$700.00 if they opt out of health benefits. She stated that offering a \$24,625 salary increase for the Deputy County Executive is unheard of and should not be used for justification for the increase. She believed that saying the restructuring is saving County money was misleading since two (2) subcontingency budget lines were being used in the amount of \$68.825. She explained that subcontingency is an account the Legislature uses to put money aside that we choose not to put into a specific line item. She stated that if we do not use the funds for the specific line item, then the amount would go back into the general fund. She stated that if we had to use these subcontingency funds for the intended purpose, the balance of \$68,825 would have gone into contingency and the County Executive's proposed restructuring would have a \$4,101 shortfall. She stated that as Legislator Nacerino stated, "this is nothing more than creative financing." She explained that while she supports the County Executive's plan to restructure his Administration to serve the people of Putnam County as he sees fit, it is her job as a Legislator to review and make informed decisions. She stated that the Legislature is a separate and equal branch of government and it is her job to review the facts and make a decision based on those facts on behalf of the taxpayers of Putnam County. She stated that she supported the County Executive's hiring and restructuring, eliminating positions, appointments and purchasing plans. She looked forward to working with the new Administration and she

believed there would be exciting things to come with this Administration. However, at this time she could not support an increase in salary after increasing this salary account line a few months ago.

Legislator Gouldman explained that the Legislature was voting on a budgetary transfer for the reorganization and reclassification of staffing for the new Putnam County Executive. He explained that when there is a new County Executive in Putnam County, or when any other New York State County Executive takes office, that new CEO has their own ideas and ways in which they want to run their county. He explained that he would like to see County Executive Byrne succeed in moving Putnam County forward in a positive way and allow him to structure his office to obtain that goal. He explained that Personnel Director Paul Eldridge wrote a memorandum to the Legislature which supported the proposed reorganization. Legislator Gouldman proceeded to read an excerpt from said memorandum. He stated that Director Eldridge believed that County Executive Byrne submitted the most comprehensive restructuring to date. Legislator Gouldman believed that the new Administration was being fiscally responsible and is saving the County \$64,000 with this proposal. He expressed his support for this proposal.

Legislator Castellano believed that the County Executive has presented a good proposal and he has an experienced employee that he would like to hire. He stated that he would support the County Executive's decision to hire this person at the proposed salary. He explained that the proposal creates a \$64,724 savings for the taxpayers. He stated that he would support the salary increase.

Legislator Montgomery explained that as the Legislature was discussing the rationale of this proposal, it was mentioned that we do not make people whole because of where they came from. She stated that statement was not true because we have done it. She believed we did it for the Sheriff's Department during the budget season when we gave the Sheriff's command staff a 19% increase to make them whole.

Chairman Jonke stated that we have a new County Executive who has a different vision than the previous County Executive. He believed he was entitled to staff his office as he deems appropriate. He stated that the County Executive presented a package that saves the taxpayers \$64,000. He stated that he supported the County Executive's vision.

Chairman Jonke called for a Roll Call Vote on the salary increase of \$24,000.

By Roll Call Vote: Six Ayes – Legislators Castellano, Crowley, Ellner, Gouldman, Montgomery and Chairman Jonke. Two Nays – Legislators Addonizio & Sayegh. Legislator Nacerino was absent. Motion Carries.

Chairman Jonke moved for discussion on the last bullet for the new \$40,000 for licensing software.

Legislator Ellner made a motion to table this item; seconded by Legislator Crowley.

Chairman Jonke called for a Roll Call Vote on the motion to table.

By Roll Call Vote: Six Ayes - Legislators Addonizio, Castellano, Crowley, Ellner, Sayegh and Chairman Jonke. Two Nays – Legislators Gouldman & Montgomery. Legislator Nacerino was absent. Motion Carries.

Chairman Jonke called for a discussion on the remaining items on the resolution.

Legislator Sayegh stated that she supported the rest of the County Executive's reorganization plan. She stated that it was exciting to see new leadership here in Putnam County.

Item #6t – Approval/ Putnam County's Request to Extend the 1% Increased County Sales Tax for an Additional Three Years was next. On behalf of the members of the Audit & Administration Committee, Legislators Ellner and Gouldman, Legislator Castellano moved the following:

Legislator Castellano stated that this is always a difficult subject to discuss. However, he believed it was a good way to collect revenue to take the burden off the homeowners of Putnam County. He explained that the 1% increased sales tax revenue generated would be paid by anyone who shops in the County.

Legislator Addonizio stated that this is important legislation that she fully supports. She believed that the additional 1% sales tax equaled approximately \$20 million in revenue for the County.

Legislator Sayegh stated that without this \$20 million in sales tax revenue, property taxes would need to be increased. She stated that she supported this legislation.

Legislator Ellner stated that this was originally supposed to be a temporary measure which we have now come to rely on. He stated that with the current budget, the only thing we can do is to vote for it. He explained that moving forward, as the Chairman of the Economic Development & Energy Committee, he would like to investigate additional revenue streams so that we can eventually eliminate this.

Legislator Montgomery believed that eliminating it would be to petition the State to make it permanent. She stated that this temporary gesture we take every two (2) years is hard to accept as it is a very difficult thing to consider doing. She believed it was no secret that County services are not shared equitably across towns. She explained that what we once thought we were getting for our tax dollars in District #1, we now have a new proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) from the Sheriff's Department which involves a mutual aid plan that will incur costs to the towns for services that we are currently receiving. She explained that it would not be a given that property taxes would be increased without this 1% sales tax revenue. She stated that other counties across the State have decreased property taxes over the past few years, and yet Putnam County has not. She stated that we have continued to increase taxes and decrease services. She stated that the County has one (1) of the highest sales tax rates in New York State and the sales tax revenue is not shared with municipalities on a regular basis. She stated that she would be voting no on this legislation.

Chairman Jonke stated that during the Committee meeting, the Commissioner of Finance pointed out that this 1% represents approximately \$20 million worth of revenue. He stated that we know there is not \$20 million worth of fat to cut out of our budget, so if this does not get passed, we would have to ask our taxpayers for a 40% increase in

property tax. He stated that he is in favor of the additional 1% sales tax. He believed that at some point this should be made permanent. He stated that there is no way to make up for that 1% loss in revenue other than increasing property tax, which he believed was not an acceptable option.

RESOLUTION #46

APPROVAL/PUTNAM COUNTY'S REQUEST TO EXTEND THE 1% INCREASED COUNTY SALES TAX FOR AN ADDITIONAL THREE YEARS

WHEREAS, by Resolution #68 of 2020, the Putnam County Legislature approved the introduction and passage of legislation for the continued authorization of Putnam County's sales tax to be increased from three percent (3%) to four percent (4%) for period December 1, 2020, through November 30, 2023, which authorization is about to expire and needs to be renewed; and

WHEREAS, the Putnam County Executive and Putnam County Legislature further determine that as an alternative to dramatically raising real property taxes in Putnam County, it is necessary to renew the expiring one percent (1%) County sales tax increase; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Putnam County Executive and Putnam County Legislature hereby support and request the introduction and passage of legislation authorizing the renewal of the expiring one percent (1%) County sales tax increase for an additional three (3) years, that is, for the period December 1, 2023, through November 30, 2026; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Putnam County Legislature is hereby directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to our State representatives in the State Legislature as well as the Governor and leadership of our State Legislature.

Chairman Jonke read the procedure for public comment on the proposed Local Law amending Chapter 220 of the Code of Putnam County Entitled "Taxation" which pertains to a partial Real Property Tax Exemption for members of the Volunteer Fire Departments & Ambulance Corps. A. Gerald Schramek with the Town of Southeast and Village of Brewster Southeast Joint Fire District stated that he represents the largest fire district in Putnam County that responded to over 3,000 emergency calls in 2022. APPROVAL/ LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 220 OF THE CODE OF PUTNAM COUNTY ENTITLED "TAXATION" (Members of Volunteer Fire Depts & Ambulance Corps Exemption)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the County of Putnam as follows:

Section 1.

Article X of Chapter 220 of the Putnam County Code as added by L.L. No. 1 of 2003 is hereby repealed and replaced as follows:

ARTICLE X

Exemption for Qualified Members of Volunteer Fire Departments and Ambulance Corps

§ 220-65 Legislative intent.

Chapter 670 of the Laws of 2022 added a new section 466-a to the Real Property Tax Law, repealing prior sections 466-a through 466-k, though continuing the exemption provided therein. New section 466-a provides a real property tax exemption of 10% for qualified members of volunteer fire departments and ambulance corps statewide, subject to adoption by individual municipalities. Members of volunteer fire departments and ambulance corps provide valuable services to the people of Putnam County. In order to be certified and recertified, such volunteers must undertake numerous hours of training on their own time and frequently at their own expense. The purpose of this exemption is to maintain the ranks of the volunteer corps and encourage volunteers to join. The enabling legislation enacted by the State Legislature requires that localities must adopt a local law in order to afford those volunteers such exemption.

§ 220-66 Requirements.

Such exemption shall not be granted to an enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service residing in such county unless:

- A. The applicant resides in the city, town, or village which is served by such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service;
- B. The property is the primary residence of the applicant;
- C. The property is used exclusively for residential purposes; provided however, that in the event any portion of such property is not used exclusively for the applicant's residence but is used for other purposes, such portion shall be subject to taxation and the remaining portion only shall be entitled to the exemption provided by this section; and
- D. The applicant has been certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or voluntary ambulance service as an enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or voluntary ambulance service for a period of five years of service.
- E. The applicant must file a certificate from his or her qualifying organization that he or she is an enrolled member. Such certification of membership must certify that the member received credit under a service award program defined by Article 11-A, 11-AA, 11-AAA, or 11-AAAA of the General Municipal Law for the period of service claimed in the application.

§ 220-67 Lifetime exemption.

Any enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service who accrues more than twenty years of active service and is so certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service, shall be granted the ten percent exemption as authorized by this section for the remainder of his or her life as long as his or her primary residence is located within such county.

§ 220-68 Spousal exemption where member is killed in the line of duty.

Un-remarried spouses of volunteer firefighters or volunteer ambulance workers killed in the line of duty. An exemption granted under this chapter shall be continued, and a pre-existing exemption shall be reinstated, where the exemption was previously claimed by an enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service, to such deceased enrolled member's un-remarried spouse if such member is killed in the line of duty; provided, however, that:

A. Such un-remarried spouse is certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service as an un-remarried spouse of an

enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service who was killed in the line of duty; and

- B. Such deceased volunteer had been an enrolled member for at least five years; and
- C. Such deceased volunteer had been receiving the exemption prior to his or her death.

§ 220-69 Spousal exemption where member is deceased.

Un-remarried spouses of deceased volunteer firefighters or volunteer ambulance workers. An exemption granted under this chapter shall be continued, and a pre-existing exemption shall be reinstated, to an un-remarried spouse of a deceased enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service; provided, however, that:

- A. Such un-remarried spouse is certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service as an un-remarried spouse of a deceased enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service; and
- B. Such deceased volunteer had been an enrolled member for at least twenty years; and
- C. Such deceased volunteer and un-remarried spouse had been receiving the exemption for such property prior to the death of such volunteer.

§ 220-70 Application for exemption.

- A. Application for such exemption, along with the certificate of membership defined above, shall be filed with the applicable town assessor on or before the taxable status date on a form as prescribed by the Commissioner of the Office of Real Property Tax Services.
- B. Certification shall be required for any period of time claimed by an applicant that is not already on file with the applicable town assessor.
- C. The assessor shall review the application and certification to ensure they have satisfied the requirements of this law.

§ 220-71 Continuation of exemption.

No applicant who is a volunteer firefighter or volunteer ambulance worker who by reason of such status is receiving any benefit under the provisions of this article on the effective date of this section shall suffer any diminution of such benefit because of the provisions of this section. Any exemption under Article X of Chapter 220 as added by L.L. No. 1 of 2003 shall be considered the same and equivalent to the exemption available under this article.

Section 3.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon the filing with the secretary of state.





I. INTRODUCTION

The New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) seeks applications from law enforcement agencies to fund body-worn carneras (BWC) and applicable software/equipment. Approximately (ten million dollars) \$10,000,000 is expected to be available to fund BWCs and applicable equipment/software for local law enforcement agencies outside of New York City.

Body-worn cameras are intended to improve police officer interactions with the public and serve as an integrated part of an agency's problem-solving and community-engagement strategy, helping to increase public trust and communication. This funding will support up to 5,000 new BWCs. Funding will be prioritized to equip those departments/agencies that currently do not have a BWC program or have a BWC program that is being expanded, as well as those jurisdictions where the demonstrated need is greatest based on survey responses collected earlier this year by DCJS.

DCJS enhances public safety by providing resources and services that inform decision making and improve the quality of the criminal justice system. DCJS is a multi-function criminal justice support agency with a variety of responsibilities, including collection and analysis of statewide crime data; operation of the DNA databank and criminal fingerprint files; administration of federal and state criminal justice funds; identifying and funding programs that reduce crime, recidivism, and victimization. Additionally, DCJS administers the state's Sex Offender Registry. DCJS conducts research on critical criminal justice issues and provides training, legal guidance and regulation to the State's law enforcement, community corrections and prosecutorial communities.

DCJS is committed to providing programs that improve the effectiveness of New York's criminal justice system. Applications will be selected for funding consistent with the best interest of the state.

II. BODY-WORN CAMERA PROGRAM INFORMATION

Throughout New York and the United States, law enforcement agencies are deploying BWCs to increase the safety of, and improve interactions between, officers and the public, as well as to collect potentially useful evidence.

BWCs also are proving to be an important tool to assist broader law enforcement, problem-solving, and community engagement strategies within jurisdictions across the state and country.

This deployment of BWCs is intended to improve police officer interactions with the public and serve as an integrated part of a law enforcement agency's problem-solving and community-engagement strategy, helping to increase public trust and communication.

All funded departments/agencies must have a BWC policy in place that meets or exceeds the provisions set forth in the Municipal Police Training Council's (MPTC) Body-Worn Camera Model Policy published by the NYS Division of Criminal Justice Services. See <u>MPTC "Body-Worn Camera Model Policy," issued September 2015.</u>

Awards will be granted to each individual applicable department/agency that is selected for an award. There will be no contracts executed between DCJS and individual award recipients. Payment will be issued directly to award recipients in the amounts approved by DCJS.

III. FUNDING INFORMATION AND ELIGIBILITY

A. Funding

Approximately \$10,000,000 will be made available to support the body-worn camera program. Funding under this program must supplement, not supplant, non-grant funds that would otherwise be available for expenditure on the programs proposed.

1. Availability and Approved Use of State Funds

All awards are subject to the availability of funds. Applicants should anticipate that awards under this initiative are one-time awards and should propose project activities and deliverables that can be accomplished without additional and/or subsequent funding. Agencies receiving awards should plan for the institutionalization of the project after grant funds are no longer available, including any prerequisite training requirements. This is a one-time payment for body-worn cameras and software related to body-worn cameras, not for the continued maintenance of such.

Funding will be prioritized as follows:

- a. Departments/agencies having no BWCs or BWC program in place;
- Departments/agencies that have a BWC program in place, but need additional BWCs to expand it beyond a pilot or partial deployment of BWCs to applicable personnel, assignments, or units; and
- c. Departments/agencies that have a BWC program in place but need new or additional BWCs, or that have otherwise demonstrated a need based on survey responses collected earlier this year.

B. Applicant Eligibility and Requirements

Eligible applicants include local law enforcement agencies (e.g., police departments and sheriff's offices) in jurisdictions in New York State outside of New York City.

Funding requests must be submitted on the attached Body-Worn Camera Application Form as: "Number of [BWC] Bundles Being Requested". Each bundle award amount will be up to \$2,000.

Awardees must be current with the required submission to DCJS of their Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) or Incident-Based Reports (IBR).

Awardees must have a BWC policy in place or in development that meets or exceeds the provisions set forth in the MPTC Body-Worn Camera Model Policy, which is referenced and linked above; such BWC policy must be in place by the time payment is issued.

Awardees must have a State Financial Services (SFS) vendor ID registered with New York State or must have an SFS number by the time payment is issued.

IV. APPLICATION/FORM INFORMATION

Applicants must electronically submit the attached Body-Worn Camera Application as instructed. If DCJS does not receive the attached form, the applicant will not receive funding. Please be sure all fields are complete before submission.

V. NOTIFICATION OF AWARDS

Applicants approved for funding will be notified in writing by DCJS via email to the email address provided in the attached application form.

VI. PAYMENT

If selected for funding, each individual agency/department shall receive a one-time payment for their entire award as determined by DCJS.

Based on survey results that DCJS conducted of law enforcement agencies in early 2022, DCJS contacted the NYS Office of General Services (OGS) regarding their state contract for the purchase of Body-Worn Camera equipment. 



RE: Budgetary Amendment 23A006 - DCJS Grant Maintenance & Leasing Costs

The Putnam County Sheriff's Office, as provided at the February 21, 2023, Protective Services Committee Meeting is in receipt of a one-time Grant Award through the NYS Division of Criminal Justice Services in the amount of \$40,000.00 for the purchase of body worn cameras (BWC). This Grant does not fund continued maintenance and/or leasing.

The amount awarded, via the DCJS Grant, will provide for twenty (20) BWC's bundles for the Sheriff's Office. Please note that a bundle consists of the following: an AXON camera unit, associated software, licensing, accessories and the TASER 7 Conducted Energy Device (CED), unlimited storage and pathway to the EVIDENCE.COM program. The Grant provides funding only for a bundle purchase as defined and determined by DCJS.

The Grant does not cover continued maintenance and leasing costs associated with the AXON award, which are provided below.

The Putnam County Sheriff's Office would sign, as approved by the Legislature, a forty-four (44) month contract which shall coincide with the existing AXON contract.

The initial \$40,000 Grant from NYS DCJS will cover Year 1 costs with the remaining balance to be applied in Year 2. The remainder of the forty-four (44) month contract becomes the responsibility of Putnam County.

The costs for leasing and maintenance are as follows:

Year 1 – \$38,708.26 (estimated on a projected May 2023 start date

Year 2 - \$55,829.22 (less \$1,291.74 from remainder of Grant fund for cost of \$54,537.48)

Year 3 - \$58,062.43

Year 4 - \$60,384.79

There shall be additional savings for Putnam County in training and equipment costs with the migration of the Correctional Facility Personnel and Special Patrol Officers (SPO) to a standardized agency-wide curriculum and supplies for the TASER 7.



WHEREAS, the elimination of this ACA eFMAP federal pass-thru will require the 57 counties to spend at least \$280 million more in SFY 2024, and approximately \$1 billion when New York City is included; and

WHEREAS, the elimination of this ACA eFMAP federal pass-thru will increase Putnam County's state-mandated burden of funding the nonfederal Medicaid match by approximately \$1.3 million in 2024; and

WHEREAS, the SFY 2024 costs to counties and New York City are scheduled to grow by 30 percent by SFY 2027; and

WHEREAS, it is the strong view of Putnam County that Congress intended these federal savings to be shared with counties proportional to the amount they contributed toward the nonfederal Medicaid match; and

WHEREAS, based on an analysis by NYSAC, since 2003, New York State has shared the funds proportionally during periods when an enhanced federal Medicaid match was enacted by Congress; and

WHEREAS, enacted in 2011, the Medicaid statutory cap for all 62 counties is \$7.6 billion; the Medicaid statutory cap for the 57 counties outside of New York City is \$2.25 billion; and

WHEREAS, starting in SFY 2014, New York began sharing these federal ACA savings directly with counties. The savings for a year were provided by lowering the weekly payments each county and NYC make to the state to support the State's Medicaid program. Through February 1, 2023, New York State continues to share the federal savings from the ACA eFMAP with the 57 counties and NYC; and

WHEREAS, counties strongly disagree with the need to cut county funding so deeply when the Governor's budget proposes to fully fund its own reserves two years ahead of schedule, depositing \$5.4 billion into reserves before the end of SFY 2023, while







Dear County Executive Byrne & Commissioner Carlin,

Further to our recent communications pertaining to our use of ARPA funds, set forth below is a summary of the projects on which the Town is currently working, assistance with which we would truly appreciate relating to the re-appropriate of funds.

- Reduction of Phosphorus in Watershed Area, which involves drainage repair from Hiawatha and Wenonah Road, and from Oscawana Lake Road. It is imperative that this project move ahead as soon as possible for the health of Oscawana Lake, and in turn for the health of our residents who enjoy the lake throughout the summer months. The estimated cost of this project is \$483,120.00, a copy of which is attached for your information.
- Bell Hollow Bridge Replacement Plan The current condition of the bridge is of serious concern, and the bridge needs to be replaced as a matter of urgency to ensure public safety. The total estimated cost for this project at this time is \$1,290,445.43 (a copy is attached for your ease of reference), which includes, but is not limited to, removal of the existing bridge, installation of the new bridge (including all construction materials, asphalt, etc. required for the same), vegetative restoration, maintenance and traffic protection, mobilization fees, construction infection fees, and design and engineering costs. Our intention is to do as much of the above-referenced work in-house as possible, which will decrease the total cost of the project to hopefully just under \$1,000,000.

These projects will be worked on simultaneously within the Town of Putnam Valley due to the immediate necessity associated with them. The costs associated with these undertakings are a substantial burden on the taxpayers of the Town. The re-appropriation of previously approved funds from Putnam County would greatly alleviate and offset this encumbrance.

Scope of Work

The Town of Putnam Valley wishes to install 765 linear feet of 36 inch HDPE stormwater pipe with three catchbasins, three manholes and a concrete headwall with rip rap dissipater from the intersection of Oscawana Lake Road and Hiawatha Road along Wenonah Road to a discharge location at the toe of the slope. The stormwater conveyance piping will facilitate the removal of nutrients from the paddock area on the horse farm from the conveyance that makes its way to Oscawana Lake, a phosphorus impaired waterbody. The conveyance is currently contributing over 30% of the phosphorus loading to Oscawana Lake, eliminating this loading will lead to improved lake health.


