

A disciplined approach toward budgeting sales tax revenue was cited as New York's Putnam County received a rating upgrade.

Moody's Investors Service upgraded the suburban county 50 miles north of Manhattan to **Aa1 from Aa2**, citing **reserves and liquidity** in line with other counties at the same rating level. The upgrade applies to roughly \$57 million of outstanding general obligation limited tax debt and a \$3.3 million public improvement bond sale the county is planning.

General Government Support Examples

- **Retiree Health Care** **\$5.7m**
 - We administer medical benefits to **945** employees and retirees
 - 555 Active Employees
 - 390 Retired Employees and surviving spouses
 - Overall Health Insurance Costs, which includes Active & Retired employees, has increased **\$1.3m (8%)** from **\$15.6m** in 2019 to **\$16.9m** in 2020




General Government Support Examples

Example Department:

- **Board of Elections \$2.0m**
 - Increase of **\$332k (20%)** for 2020 due to early voting expansion & Presidential election year
 - County does **NOT** charge back the cost to the towns





History has shown us that small property tax increases, within the tax cap, combined with prudent conservative fiscal spending practices, results in a *fiscally strong* Putnam County that meets its fiscal and social responsibilities

Putnam County Sales Tax

Sales Tax is our most Important Revenue

Numerous factors influence both positively and negatively, our sales tax revenue

- Gas Sales – driven by price per gallon which fluctuates
- Commercial and residential real estate
- The Economy

As was noted by Moody's, we book reasonable numbers based on current economic conditions

Items Accepted: Consumer commodity packaged household products only, inclusive of: Photo chemicals, non-latex driveway sealer, pool chemicals, creosote, kerosene, flammable liquids, metal polish, drain/oven cleaners, rug/upholstery cleaners, wood preservatives, turpentine, stains, varnishes, strippers, thinners, mothballs, rodent poisons, flea powders & collars, bug spray, nail polish remover, hair dyes, hair sprays, gasoline/oil mixtures, brake fluid, antifreeze, auto fluids, pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, chemical fertilizers, adhesives, resins, solvents, oil-based paints, mercury containing products, button cell batteries (from watches and hearing aids), lithium & sealed lead acid batteries, rechargeable batteries, fluorescent light bulbs and tubes, smoke detectors, propane tanks up to 20-pound size .

Items Not Accepted: Industrial or commercial type and/or quantity hazardous waste or reagents, inclusive of: Electronic waste (e-waste), used oil, latex paint, plastic bags, tires, unlabeled/unidentified containers, household batteries (AAA, AA, C, D, 9V), ammunition, explosives, fireworks, asbestos products, construction debris, furniture, toys or clothing, medical waste, old medications.

ITEMS IN GARBAGE AND/OR LAWN BAGS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

All waste is subject to inspection and will only be accepted in the County's discretion.
